

FISHER HOUSE ON THE EMERALD COAST

Dear Members.

I thought it would be helpful, especially since we have so many new members, to explain the reason why the DWC supports Fisher House on the Emerald Coast, which is located on Eglin Air Force Base.

As I mentioned at last week's Luncheon at Bonefish the reason the DWC decided to dedicate itself to raising funds for Fisher House was because we used to support the "Smiles Across the Miles" Program which was introduced for Clubs, such as ours, to collect daily essentials for our Military serving overseas in obscure places. The DWC contributed to this worthy cause by way of collecting items we all take for granted, i.e. shaving cream, deodorants and the wide swath of what we deem "essential "to our daily comforts, which the Military when deployed do not have "on hand".

When this Program was changed it meant that Clubs like ours were no longer able to contribute to the "daily essentials" to our deployed Military. However, shortly after this Program was changed, our local Media was full of news about a possible "Fisher House" being built on Eglin. It took several years and several acts of Congress to get the ground broken and then eventually Fisher House was built on Eglin Air Force Base.

Fisher House is named after a Navy Admiral's Wife who recognized the need for families of severely wounded servicemen receiving critical medical care being able to be close to that member of their Family and accommodated close to the Hospital where their son/daughter/husband was being treated without having to endure a huge financial burden finding lodgings.

Fisher House, either here at Eglin or elsewhere in the U.S. provides lodging for families who need to be close to their loved ones. Although Fisher House provides lodging to any family in need, it is a Charity and therefore that is how we, this great Club we all belong to, got involved with raising money for the daily needs of running this great House.

As I said last Wednesday, we have done quite a bit of fundraising for Fisher House in the past and now we have the opportunity to, if not raise funds, indirectly help those Families currently staying in Fisher House on Eglin Air Force Base.

Although we are not the only Non-Profit Organization that is helping Fisher House, we are needed in areas that consist of gathering non-perishable foods etc. for the Pantry at Fisher House, which you all gave so graciously to at Christmas and we can also help on months that have 5 Thursdays. Currently there are local organizations that provide Supper on the months that have four Thursdays for the families at Fisher House. For those months that have 5 Thursdays they currently do not have anyone providing Supper.

As most of you know we shall be providing Supper on January 29th and Cindy Posey has very kindly offered to make Spaghetti and Meatballs. And at the January luncheon, a number of you so kindly signed up to help with Fisher House. So, we will be thinking about future 5th Thursdays and how we can provide for those families.

I thank all of you who have signed up to help either by taking the time to be a part of "the DWC Meals on Wheels for Fisher House" or raising money for this great Charity.

Cindy and I look forward to seeing those of you who have signed up to provide a part of what I know will be a wonderful Supper for some very deserving families on the 29th.
